


Realizing that a change is needed is simple. Capitalizing on that need requires the strength of a Tiger. "Be a Tiger, show your stripes!"



To the graduates, you are on the middle step of a long staircase, you have made it half way. Use all that you have learned and have it propel you to the top of any endeavor you choose to pursue.




May 14, 1994



To all those who knew him; we say unto him 'God Rest, Until We Meet Again'.







Later in the day, we broke up into separate workshops dealing with violence, first impressions and societal concerns in general.



Steven Tyler once wrote: "It's amazing, with the blink of an eye you finally see the light. It's amazing, when the moment arrives that you know, you'll be alright."

I sit alone in my room. It is darkening outside and the distant North End traffic passes. This is the room that has watched me grow, heard me laugh and sob. I don't think a moment like this has ever passed when I don't fondly recollect memories of the room we all share, St. John's High.

Our junior high experience was a bitter-sweet candy. These were our years where our appearance, achievements and our friends were the world to us. Every experience was either like a first kiss or like a stubbed toe. There were times when we felt ugly or like outcasts and it was tears, upset stomaches because "no one told us it was going to be like this and we wished we were in bed and under the covers so just leave us alone, please." Our parents and teachers watched us walk away from our childhood and stumble into adolescence.

The sky outside my window is deepening now. Not as many cars pass.

I guess we thought that things only got easier with age. In ways it did, but in other ways...It wasn't so much that we were getting older, but that we were getting wiser. These years meant different friends, different teachers, different expectations. This meant experimenting and testing ourselves as individuals and our values. And it wasn't a matter of whether "we should have or shouldn't have, because this was what we wanted to do...wasn't it?" The whole ride was wild and scary and sort of thrilling.

But sometimes, it was just so hard to keep up. "I mean, it's not like we didn't care, or didn't try but, man...there's just so much to do...I mean, I have to...but then I want to...and I don't know why she's mad at me and he probably thinks I'm a loser." And we'd flop back onto our bed and find comfort in our pillows. But things weren't so bad the next week. "Just hang in there." And we did and we found that we were alright. Everyday was a new learning experience. We were survivors.

We found ourselves spending more time with our close friends, our best friends. And these special people "liked <u>my</u> company; they thought I was funny and smart and liked <u>me</u>...I remember hanging out with...and that one Friday night when...then there was that party at...And, gee, am I ever going to miss you guys 'cause you guys...you are the best. And I know we never really broke it down to this but, I love you guys. And I want you to know that I never wanted the fun to die.

The teachers watched us grow from 4 feet 10 inches to 11 feet tall. They were mom and dad from 9:00 to 3:30, some until 9:00 at night. They gave our lives direction and forgave us when we were rotten. So, no hard feelings. We were inspired by you. Thank you for your generosity, patience and sincerity.

Our families; perhaps overlooked a little too often. We told them to leave us alone "because we know what we were doing, okay?!" But you know, there were times when we really needed them, wished we could sit on Mom's lap and let her rock us to sleep, and we were sorry we pushed them away. So to Ma, Dad, Gram and Gramps, thank you. And I'd really like to be your friend, if that's alright with you. We hope you are proud of us because we've always been so proud of you.

To the rest who haven't come this far and haven't seen the end of St. John's, take good care of her for us, would you please. As humans, we often take things for granted. St. John's is far too precious to do such. We leave the future of St. John's with you; take pride in what is yours.

Look around, won't you? Remember him? And her? Your best friend is sitting at the end of the row. These faces of the hallways, library, cafeteria and gym will soon be vivid images left for your memory. Today, we are united by caps and gowns...and we find we aren't so different from one another after all. Lend me your hand, please, as we take our final step over this rugged mountain and blow St. John's a final kiss farewell.

Our room is quiet now. The sky has deepened and darkened. We remember them, us and you. In the shadows dance our memories at St. John's High.


