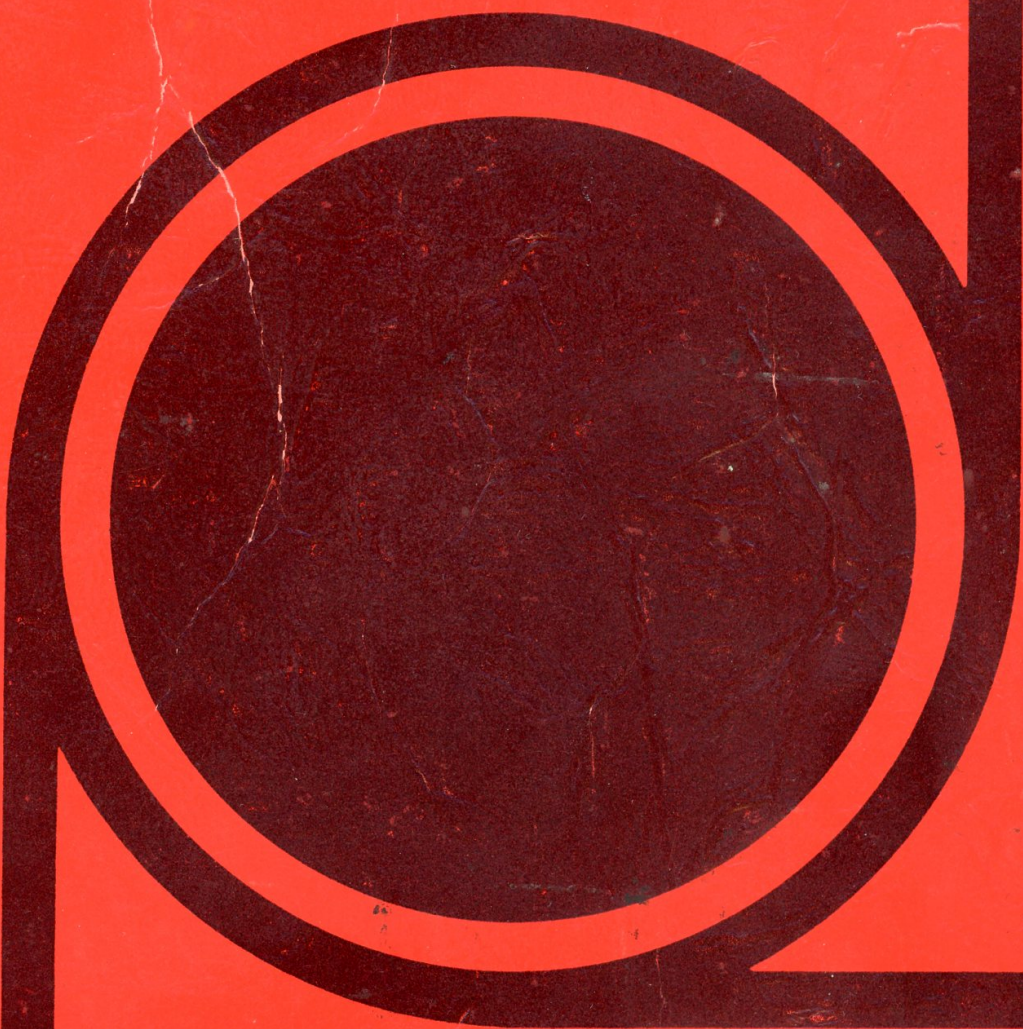

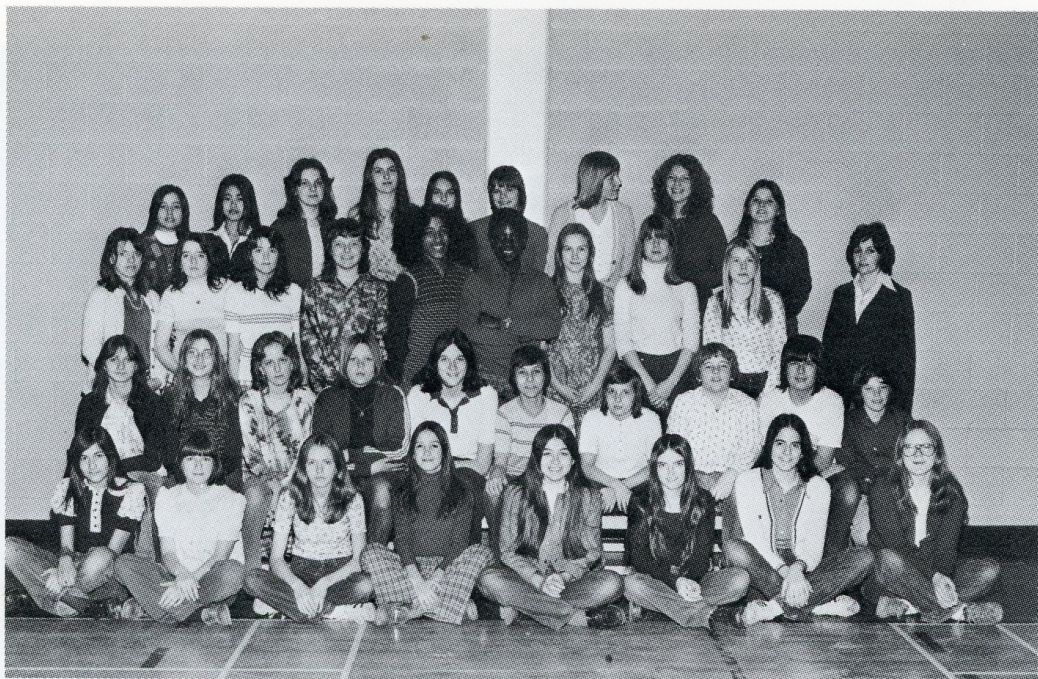


# *Jr. High Council*



## JUNIOR HIGH COUNCIL REPORT

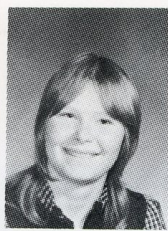
