




Congratulations to the class of 1987! On behalf on the entire staff of St. John's High School may I offer best wishes for future success and happiness.


February 19th, 40 St. John's students set out from the school parking lot — destination Agassiz Ski Area.

Mr. T. Wolfe told the astronomy club about the wonders of the universe and then took the members out to observe them.



The Varsity boys' basketball team, under the dedication of Mr. R. Horaska had a successful season.


The team won 19 games and lost 15. They placed third in the City North Conference and in the "Top 8" in the Provincial Championships.






COACHES IMPORTED












































































VALEDICTORY ADDRESS
