The 1980 edition of the Tiger football team will go down in the books as the "cardiac kids." After breezing along with victories over Churchill (7-1), Kelvin (22-0), Tec Voc (13-6), and Grant Park (65-0) they ran into trouble in the form of the St. Paul's Crusaders. A bad second quarter cost our team a 26-8 defeat. They recovered with a 24-8 win over Elmwood but lost the last game of the season 22-6 to the undefeated D.M.C.I. Maroons on a poor field. However the 5-2 record qualified us for the playoffs where we again met the mighty Maroons in the semifinal. In a highly entertaining free scoring affair our team played the game of their lives in scoring a come from behind 40-36 victory. D.M.C.I. led 22-21 at the half and went ahead to 36-21, but our Tigers fought back for the win and a berth in the final against St. Paul's. The city final has been described as the most exciting final ever by going into overtime, a first for the league, before our team claimed the championship with a 39-25 victory. St. John's led 10-7 at halftime but St. Paul's powered back to go up 18-10 with only one minute remaining in the game. Displaying their typical "don't quit attitude our team scored in the final minute then a 2 pt. conversion tied the game 18-18 at the end of regulation time. The Tigers came out hot in the first 10 min. overtime half moving 60 yds. to paydirt to take the lead 25-18. However a fumble on our 17 yard line proved costly as St. Paul's again tied the score 25-25 at the end of the first overtime half. The second half of overtime was all St. John's as we took the lead on a blocked punt and scored again late in the overtime to take the championship.



championships in the last 10 years.




### Freshman Girls & Boys Volleyball

### Varsity Boys Volleyball




