We will always remember St. John's as the place that moulded our character and our future. The best part about it though, is that we had fun and a lot of laughs at the same time.





I would like to thank Miss Hodgson for all the advice and time she gave to us. Her help was really the success factor of our grad.




This year's social committee had one of the most outstanding years ever. Through hard work and excellent organization, this year's committee ended the year with a profit that will aid any future social activities at St. John's.


Torch Staff:

Congratulations for a job well done to the boys and Coach Dmytryshyn.


After a shaky pre-season start, the Freshman Boy's Volleyball team, under the coaching of Mr. Wiebe, did very well finishing a close second in the city championships.

Congratulations should be extended to all the hard-working boys and Mr. Wiebe for all the extra time spent practising and playing.




JUDO CLUB
