








On October 27th a Masquerade Ball and a Concert which focused on the International Year of the Child were held. The profits from these events which totaled \$950. were donated to UNICEF.

1978 proved to be a very up and down type of season after a deceiving 2-6 record the year before. It was the year of the comeback and our team did just that finishing with a 5-3 record. We made the playoffs for the seventh time in the past eight seasons.

The highlights were defeating St. Paul's 26-6, our best game of the year; coming back from a 32-12 defecit to defeat Sisler 37-32; and coming 5 yards short of doing the same thing to Gordon Bell after trailing 27-0 and eventually losing 27-22. The low point of the season was losing to Churchill on a 90 yard run with a minute and a half to go.

The semifinal saw us pitted against undefeated DMCI. For the first quarter and a half it looked like an upset was imminent with the score St. John's 10, DMCI 0. Then two big plays by Daniel sent us into the locker room down 13-10. Another big play late in the third quarter upped their lead to 19-10. Despite the fact that our team valiantly tried to come back, Daniel proved to be the better team that day winning 33-10.

Statistically speaking, fullback Ward Hrabi was our leading rusher this season with 639 yards on 87 carries. Quarterback Shann Chartrand completed 39 of 75 passes (52%) and was our leading scorer with 7 touchdowns. Vince Harris was our leading pass receiver with 139 yards on 9 receptions for a 15.4 yard average.

Generally, it was a tough year but a good one and we that remain look forward to a better season next year.






The St. John's Geography Club participated in an Open House Canada exchange with thirty students from St. Thomas High School of Pointe Claire, Quebec.

The concert proved to be a "smashing" success with students responding exuberently to the nostalgic music of the 60's, as well as to some of Burton's more recent recordings. His closing encore was: "Breaking it to Them Gently", and after singing the chorus line; "Lord I wish I were home", he added — "I am home".

Burton is a very special person with many talents; including outstanding musical ability and dedication to perfection. His greatest attribute is possibly his unique ability to make people happy.



Well, classes are dismissed now forever, And the good times come back to us in tears, Remembering how we've grown and changed together.


As we look back over the years.






