

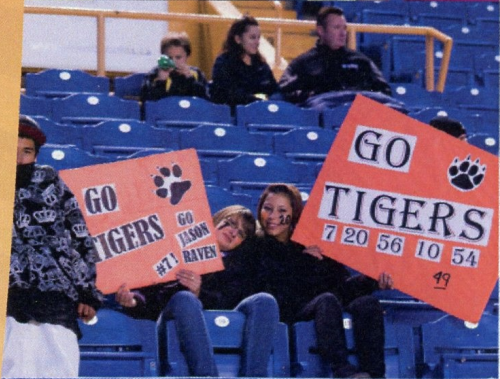

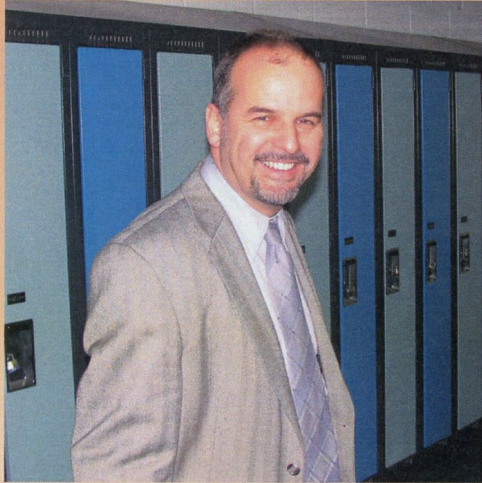
Message from the Principal

An Interview with Mr. Werner (Teacher from 1977 to 2010) by Nick Allaman

Mr. Werner celebrated forty years of teaching in Winnipeg School Division this year. He first taught at Wellington Elementary school for seven and a half years. Most of his career was spent at St. John's High School where he taught for 32 ½ years. Mr. Werner's main teaching areas were English, Social Studies, Outdoor Education and Math.

Mr. Werner decided to become a teacher because he loved working with kids, and he liked how his own teachers had interacted with and taught him in the public school system. He admits to challenging times in his career, with tough work days, and even times when he wanted to quit. But going over lesson plans, making them more fun and organized, would help him realize how exciting teaching was, and he would go back to his classes the next day feeling refreshed and ready to work with his students in exciting new ways.

If he could change one thing as a teacher, he said he probably would have volunteered for more extracurricular activities, as those activities would have made coming to work a lot more fun. He was very committed to this school, and he coached many teams including volleyball, basketball and golf. In his 12 years of teaching outdoor education courses, he has taken his students on many field trips, and has coached golf for over 30 years. He has coached his basketball teams to three city championships, and his golf team to five league championships.

Mr. Werner said that the best thing about being a teacher was that every day was different, and "you never knew what was going to happen on a particular day". He also said that teenage students could be so much fun and they always had something interesting to talk about. On the other hand, he said the worst part of being a teacher was when he saw students that didn't want to be in school, who had a very negative point of view about their daily life, and who just gave up. He said that he wanted to help them get back on the right track by offering encouragement and by showing them that with hard work and good attendance, they could do the subject work and pass. From his own experiences, that approach helped the students feel good about themselves.

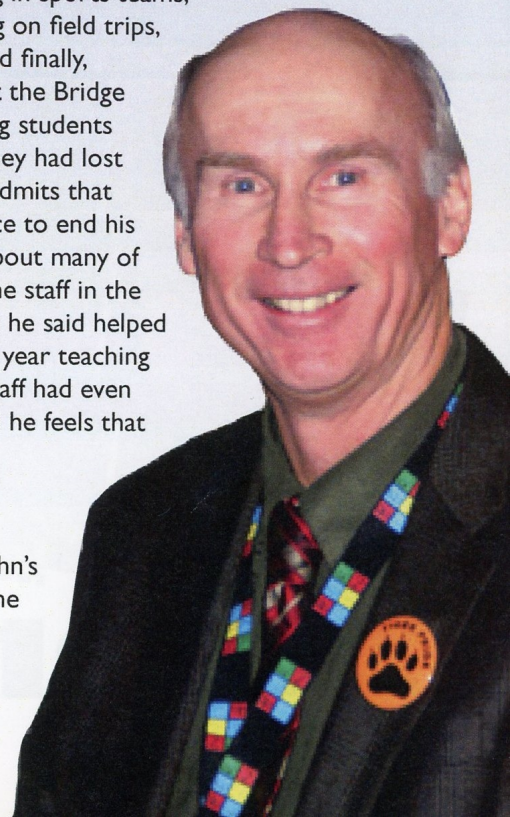
Mr. Werner felt that any new teacher that has the gift of working with students and the gift of teaching, were very blessed to have those skills. His advice to those new teachers was this: "have fun, you are going to have a great career. Also, never give up on a student. Find strategies to help that student enjoy coming to school. You can do that by making the lessons interesting and important while being very structured in your classroom approaches." To the older teachers, he felt that they were so

lucky to be a part of this profession and that they should be proud of what they have accomplished over their many years of teaching. He said that these older teachers have made a difference in the lives of many students. He feels that they should be thankful that they had the opportunity of being a teacher.

He says that teaching styles have drastically changed from how they used to be: lecture, take notes, memorize and be tested. Now there is much more interaction between the students and their teachers, but the students are also more involved in how they're being taught by helping to set the goals for their lessons, as well as having more visuals for the students to actually see what they're learning with diagrams, charts, or pictures. He feels that these new teaching styles have ultimately influenced him and his own style of teaching, in that he used more visuals and made his lessons more fun and interesting. Another way his style has been influenced is that his students were able to take part in choosing what they are learning as opposed to him directing them every step of the way. Now, students are learning in groups, learning visually, and are ultimately teaching each other, which helps them learn better because they are part of the process.

Mr. Werner says that teaching at St. John's High School was amazing. He loved partaking in sports teams, as a coach and referee, going on field trips, teaching students English, and finally, ending his career working at the Bridge Resource Centre and helping students to get back on track after they had lost hope for their futures. He admits that being the ultimate experience to end his teaching career. He talked about many of his memories he had with the staff in the schools he worked at, which he said helped to enrich his life over his 40 year teaching career. Many of his fellow staff had even become life-long friends, and he feels that that's what life is all about.

Finally, he is thankful to the Winnipeg School Division, Wellington School and St. John's High School for giving him the opportunity to work with many thousands of students over 40 years. It has been a real pleasure.

An Interview with Mr. Marks By Nick Allaman

Nick: To start off, when did you become a student at St. John's High school?

Mr. Marks: For three years from 1971 to 1973. I had transferred in from Daniel Mac.

Nick: So, when you were a student at St. John's High School, about how many students were at the school?

Mr. Marks: There were rumors that there were about 2000 people that went to the school during that time but if I had to guess it would be easily 1500 or 1600 people. We were the largest school by population. There were actually some areas of the school that used to be classrooms. For example, the life skills room used to be another hallway with four classrooms. The school was divided by grade. Sevens and eights were on the first floor and grade nine was and up on the second floor. Grade 10, 11 and 12 was on the third floor.

Nick: So, when you were a student, what were you involved in?

Mr. Marks: Well I was a bit of a jock. I was team captain in my final year and we won the league championships. I was also on the track team and had success with that. I also took part of some extra-curricular activities. I was on student council and grad committee.

Nick: How long have you been a teacher at St. John's and what have you taught?

Mr. Marks: I came over in the fall of '97. I have taught Skills for Independent Living, Law, Computer Resource and English in the Pre-Employment Program. Currently I'm back teaching Skills for Independent Living. I'm also teaching grade 9 Science. This year I'll finally be using my Phys. Ed. teaching degree.

Nick: You're also the coach of the football team. I was wondering just how long you've been doing that.

Mr. Marks: I've coached sports my whole teaching career and I've been in and out of football for all the years I've been involved in education. I first coached football to the St. John's Tigers in 1981 and 1982 as an assistant to a fellow named Rick Karaota. At that time I was teaching at Hugh John Macdonald School. I took over the team in 1993 as head coach when it was kind of thrust upon me and I said to myself I'll do it for a year or two. I've been here as the head coach pretty much ever since with the exception of 2004-2005 when I let another guy take a stab at it. In total I have coached football for about 18 or 20 years.

Nick: With all that being said would you change the fact that you've been the coach for as long as you have been or would you have

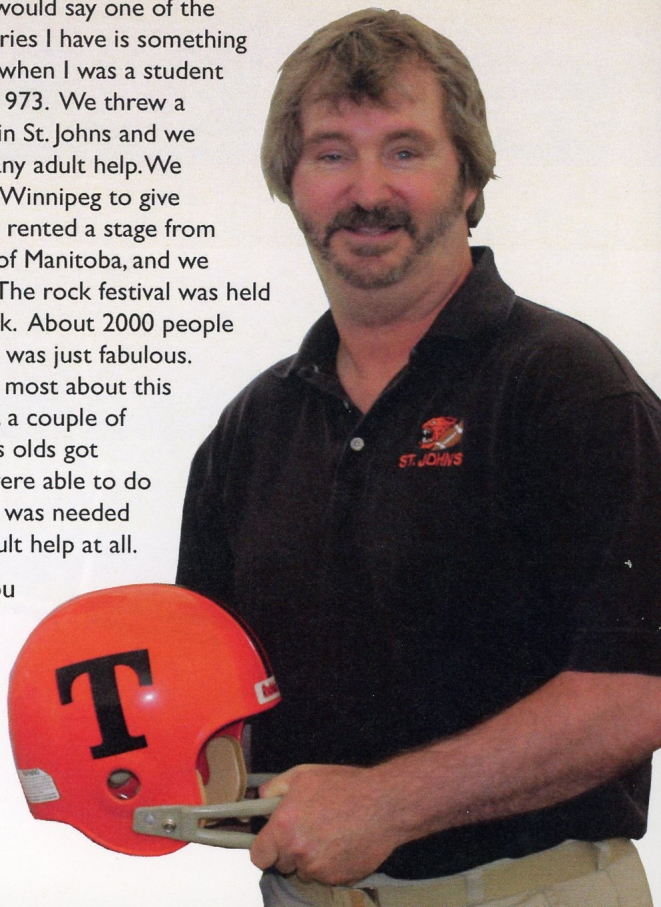
rather have stayed as just a teacher?

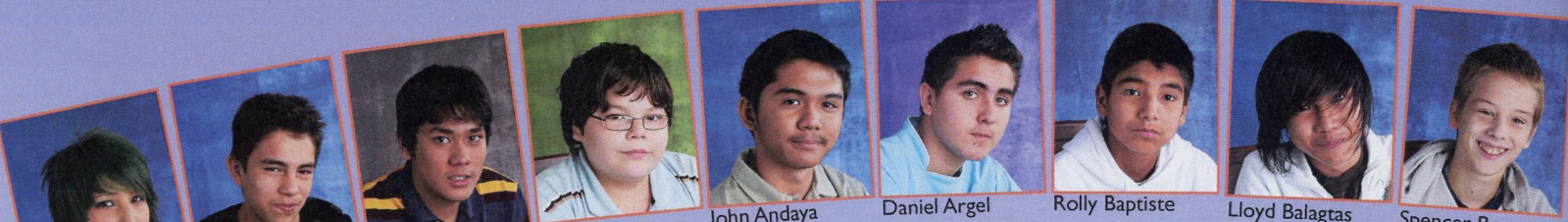
Mr. Marks: I can't think of teaching without coaching. I sometimes think that the only reason I teach high school is so I can coach. It's my passion. I guess I'll throw this out there: if I had the chance to do anything in the world and didn't have to worry about paying bills, I'd coach football. I kind of see it this way as teaching is paying the bills and my volunteer work is my purpose. Now, my employers may not like to hear that they're not the same thing, but I honestly believe that in this day and age, if you're going to be a teacher you have to do something outside of the classroom. I don't care what it is, chess club, ping pong or whatever. Education is more than what happens in the classroom.

Nick: So, for as long as you have been here what is your favorite St. Johns memory?

Mr. Marks: I have many fond St. John's memories both as a teacher and as a student. I have met some amazing people here. I would say one of the greatest memories I have is something that happened when I was a student at St. John's in 1973. We threw a music concert in St. Johns and we did it without any adult help. We got the City of Winnipeg to give us the park, we rented a stage from the University of Manitoba, and we booked bands. The rock festival was held at St. John's Park. About 2000 people attended and it was just fabulous. What I like the most about this memory is that a couple of 17 and 18 years olds got together and were able to do everything that was needed without any adult help at all.

Nick: Thank you for giving me your time in doing this interview.

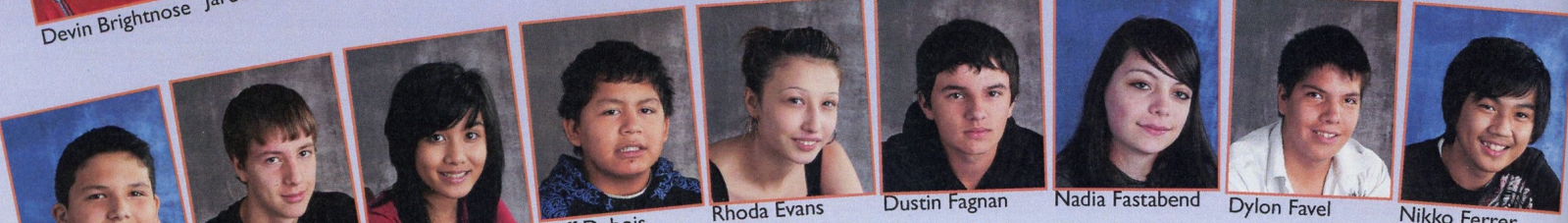




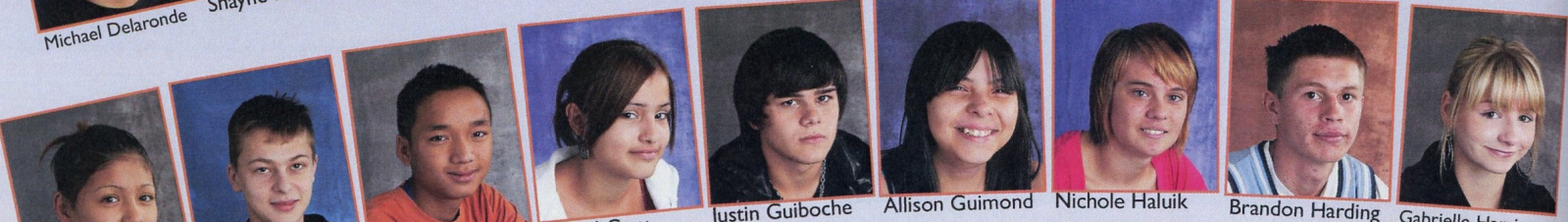

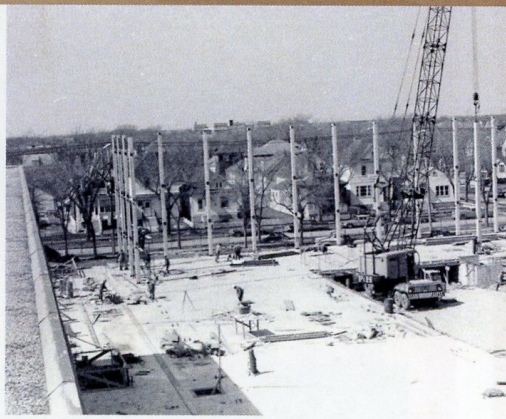


Tiger Tidbits



- Ninety-eight pupils and four teachers formed the first student body and faculty of St. John's Technical High School.
- The original school motto was "Nil Nisi Probum" meaning "Nothing but the Right"
- The cornerstone for St. John's Tech was laid in 1910.
- St. John's colors were once bronze and green. In 1911 the school colors were chosen as brown and orange.
- In March 1912, with Mr. A. C. Campbell as principal, classes were moved to the "new" building and included elementary grades having classes from 1 through 12.
- During the war years many students and nine staff were in active service.
- St. John's was the first high school to adopt a uniform, consisting of the middie and skirt for its girl students in 1926. In 1933 it changed to the tunic and blouse.
- The first "Torch" yearbook was issued in 1926. All one thousand copies were sold.
- Grade 12 was dropped in 1932 as a measure of economy.
- The Governor-General's Medals have been awarded since 1915.
- The first school newspaper was called "The Torch" and published in 1928. In 1933 it was renamed "The St. John's Times".
- In 17 years of Intercollegiate football St. John's only lost 3 times between 1918 and 1935.
- No grade nine classes were offered at St. John's from 1929 to 1955.
- In 1921 a girls' class raised money for the upkeep of graves of St. John's boys who had died during the war and were buried in England.
- Senior High St. John's Basketball teams had won the City Championship for 13 successive years.
- St. John's Hockey teams were City Champions from 1921-26, 32, & 33.
- The Torch was the school symbol since 1926.
- In 1925 the school orchestra began with 15 members. In 1928 the first Graduates' Choral Society began. Many of the St. John's girls and boys choirs were very successful in the Manitoba Music Festival.
- Dramatics have been an essential part of St. John's since 1911. The first play presented was "Ici on Parle Français."
- The current steel torch that is passed at graduation and at the Centennial Closing Exercises was made by students in the machine shops in 1935. It was first made to honor St. John's 25th Anniversary.
- One hundred fifty-five St. John's students were among the dead of World War Two.
- Students were given a two week vacation from school in order to fight the 1950 flood.
- The 1950 Flood forced a move of students and teachers to Isaac Newton and the cancellation of the Grad Dinner & Dance.
- The 1950 Student Council adopted three war orphans.
- Miss Eileen McCord is appointed vice-principal in 1952. She was the first woman to hold an administrative position at the school.
- 1960 saw the introduction of the six day cycle.
- The new school was started in 1960. It was finished in 1967.
- The new school motto is "UQUSE AD ASTRA." It has many interpretations: Right up to the Stars, Reach for the stars or Even Unto the Stars.

Tiger Tidbits



- In 1960 the school clubs included: Hi Freshman, Ballroom Dancing, Mathematics, Science, United Nations, Chess, Square Dance, Drama, French and International.
- In 1960 besides the regular team sports there were also the Cheerleaders, Curling, Tumbling, Bowling and Rifle Shooting that was held at the McGregor Armories!
- The school address changed from 480 Salter Street to 401 Church Avenue in 1967.
- In 1985 O'Meara Street was renamed Monty Hall Street in honor of our famous alumnus on June 21, 1985
- St. John's peak enrolment of 2038 students is reached in 1969.
- St. John's were the 1972 Football champions. The score was St. John's 24, Sisler 8. At kick off the temperature was -10C. By the end of the game the temperature was -20C.
- Graduate Monty Hall is famous for his long running game show "Let's Make a Deal" and for his humanitarian work. In 1988 he was awarded the prestigious Order of Canada.
- Four Tigers have won the Vanier cup with the U of M Bisons. Richard Jackiw, Mike Shylo, Don Shylo in 1969 and 70. Simon Blaszcak in 2007
- St. John's Grad Louis Slotin was a chemist and physicist who took part in the Manhattan Project. In 2002 an asteroid was named 123423 Slotin in honour of his contribution to science and the sacrifice he made to protect the lives of others.
- Two thirteen-year-olds played for St. John's Football 1967. At the time teams were grade 10 to 12 only with 19 year old players. Bruce Werbiki and John Radsiszewski were declared ineligible because they were too young, and the team wins were forfeited.
- Katherine (nee Ruccious) Weber was the oldest graduate at the 100th reunion at 101 years of age. She graduated in 1926.
- Burton Cummings played at both the 75th and 100th Anniversary Galas.

Social Dance - A St. John's Tradition

Interview with Mr. Wood by Nick Allaman

Nick: This is your second year as a teacher. As a starting teacher what are your challenges?

Mr. Wood: During my first year it was hard finding enough time to do everything. Every single day I was prepping, marking, coaching, and planning the fashion show. As a first year teacher your whole life is teaching. There is not much time for anything else.

Nick: What was your involvement with the fashion show?

Mr. Wood: When I was asked to be the teacher coordinator, I said, "Of course, I would love to do it." At that time I had no idea what was involved. As teacher coordinator I had to oversee stage setup, arrange lighting and sound, find stores to supply clothing, and find models and entertainment. Mr. Wood: My favorite would be talking to students. They are interesting and make me laugh. I don't really have a least favorite. I guess the most challenging thing is trying to give assignments back with good comments in a timely manner.

Nick: What advice do you have for students going on to post-secondary education?

Mr. Wood: I found high school easy and developed some bad study habits. As a result I got my butt kicked in first year university. I was used to teachers coming up and reminding me of assignments that were due. In university that does not happen. My advice would be to learn good study habits before going to university.

Gowns for Grads

Ms. Bulka was honoured as one of the recipients of the YMCA-YWCA's Women of Distinction Award this year due in part to her founding of the "Gowns for Grads" program.

Gowns for Grads was launched in the winter of 2009 by Ms. Bulka after the school's graduation committee realized many young women were not attending their grad because they didn't have a dress to wear. Over 1,000 gowns were donated that first year. The tally for 2010 hit over 2,000 gowns. Seventeen gowns went to St. John's graduates. In addition to gowns; shoes, accessories and cosmetics were also donated. The program was open to students from schools in and around Winnipeg.

The gowns were donated by big-hearted Winnipeggers and generous folks from across the country. Eight bridal shops in Edmonton and Calgary sent boxes of brand new dresses. Alberta farmers donated gently used dresses which would have cost \$35 in postage. Many grads who received their gowns from the program last year also donated this year in a pay-it-forward gesture.

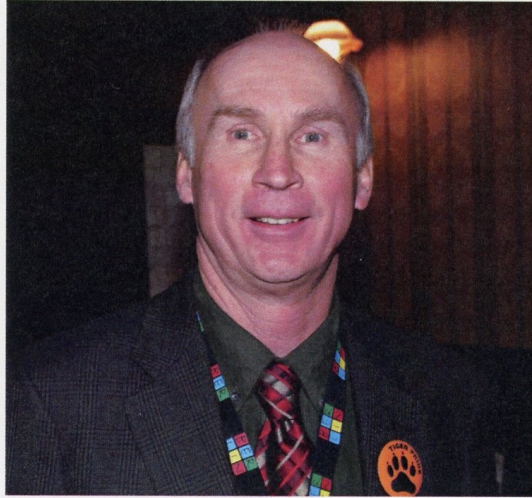
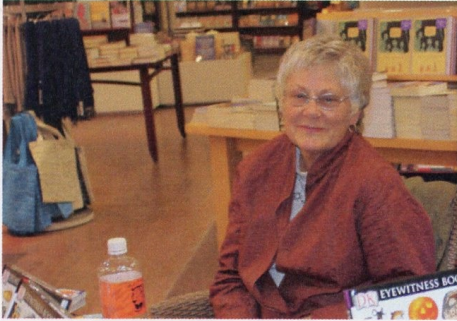

The final word from Ms. Bulka: "On behalf of the grads, I extend a heartfelt thank you to each and everyone who made the program a resounding success again this year."

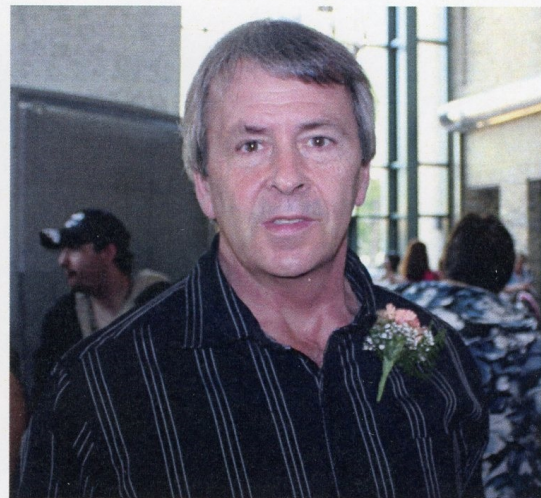
