
As we shall all eventually leave St. John's, we will not see many of those people with whom we've spent the most important years of our lives.

To the graduating class of '84, I wish you the best of luck and much success.



## Freshman Boys Volleyball




# Varsity Girls Basketball



# Track



Rugby is a team game-when we practice as a team, then we'll produce good rugby - and we will win games. We have learned from this - haven't we? We'll start again next Christmas.







Ralph Waldo Emerson once said: "Each moment of the year has its own beauty, a picture which was never seen before, and which will never be seen again." Today is one of those moments.


