






























Freshman Girls Volleyball

Valedictory Address - June Cotte - President and Valedictorian

Dr. Sharman, honored guests, parents, staff, students, and fellow graduates: As I begin to read this speech, my mind wanders to when I began to write it and further back to when I began to consider writing it. Beginning, getting started, is never easy. Essentially, that is what my thoughts are today: New beginnings and endings.

Our thoughts over the last year have skirted over those themes. Many looked forward to graduation as the beginning of a new life, while others looked upon it as the end of their childhood. It is much the same as the pessimist versus optimist argument over half a glass of water. It is either half-full or half-empty. Each one of us has looked forward to this day for various reasons and will remember it as a beginning or as an end.

An end to what? This is not an easy question to deal with but on reflection it is easier to answer than many exam questions were. In simple terms, objective, outsiderlooking-in terms, it is the end of high school. . Nothing more; nothing less. But to us, the

integral ingredients of graduation, it is an end to much much more.

Graduation means an end to waiting for September class lists to be posted. It's an end to yearly seating plans which remain in effect for one week, being computerized into numbers on report cards, trying to remember your REAL homeroom number by May or June, Fran's cooking, and gymbags heavier than yourself, leaving a permanent slouch in one shoulder. It's an end to walking or bussing, to school at 40 below and hunderds of hours of studying. It's also an end to the hundreds of hours we spent figuring out which teachers kept attendence, how many absences we had and which classes we could . . . shall we say . . . miss. Triple studies, tanning and frisbee at lunchtime, all these things are over. But more importantly, also over is the togetherness of a group of people all working towards a common goal, that goal being realized today. It is an end to casual friendships which are taken for granted but when non-existent, are sorely missed.

During our three or perhaps six years at St. John's, we have accumulated a wealth of casual aquaintences. Perhaps never again in our lives will we meet so many people in so short a time and become relatively close to them. When we leave here, when we end our schooling, we will also leave many friends by the wayside. This is a sombre thought, perhaps not appropriate for such a day of celebration but still and all, I'm discussing endings.

Some of these companions have been special teachers. Most teachers are much maligned and scorned, but there are rare qualities in a teacher who really cares that endear us to them and make our departure feel that much more a definite ending, and a distant loss.

I could dwell considerably longer on the nostalgia of our years here. However, everyone at this moment may have a special memory, a remembrance of high school they want to cherish.

So we're on to new beginnings. New doors to open, or break down. New challenges, broad new horizons, a new chapter of life. This is a moment we have waited for, ten months a year for 13 years. Well, maybe we only waited passionately for a couple of years. Never mind, we still waited. If it seemed the wait was interminible, it now seems only a very brief time that we have

And now we're "on our own". We are facing a demanding world which has already forced us to make career and scholastic choices. Are we ready? Are we prepared to accept the responsibilities of "adulthood"? There are no make-up classes at university and no tangible proofs of ourselves to succeed in any endeavor. These endeavors for us will mean further studying perhaps, working 9-5 or even job-hunting.

My advice to the grads may sound overused or stale but it still rings true. Do not look back. EVER. Do not let yourself pause and vacillate, missing opportunities in the meanwhile. Attempt everything, even if it may seem impossible. To try and to fail is

much better than standing safely by the sidelines, never daring to get involved, fearing failure, and forever asking "what

I am generally a pessimist, however I do believe in grad as a beginning. It is the beginning of the freedom to make choices. It's the start of a fresh chapter of the unique book composed of our lives. If life goes in steps like the rungs of a ladder we now have a foot poised on the next step. Perhaps we are frightened and intimidated by the height but the exhilaration of the climb and the feeling of accomplishment are constantly sending us higher and higher.

Though many of the names and faces may fade in our memory we will of course, always remember our years here. Our own embryonic philosophies of life have been formulated here. The lessons in human relations learned amongst ourselves will remain with us

forever.

Each of us will take something from St. John's and carry it within ourselves perhaps forever. It seems we have given nothing in return. However, if we do the best possible job we can in life, succeeding to the utmost of our capabilities, then we have indeed given something back to our school, the pride of a job well done.
