
In the years ahead, I wish for you every success in your individual endeavours, and may your combined efforts as students of St. John's cause those who follow to reflect with pride upon your achievements.

What is to come is in your hands".





VALEDICTORY SPEECH

Mr. Ryckman, Mr. Promislow, honoured guests, fellow students: It is always difficult to convey the full force of an experience to someone who has not undergone the same experience. Grade twelve, however, is something which most of you have undergone and now, I, too, have had my turn. However, although I represent the grade twelve student body I cannot speak for all my fellow students. I can only speak for myself and I must admit that I am a bit relieved as well as saddened.

The year has been a rather hard one. For me, and probably for many of my fellow students the world has often seemed to consist merely of a desk, a lamp, four walls, and a mass of papers you could not understand. You suddenly discovered that you could survive on six hours of sleep, and it wasn't surprising to fall asleep at four o'clock in the afternoon. Concepts were thrown at you and you were forced to unscramble them yourself. Novels were read and essays were written in unending cycles. Students coached students and it wasn't a time for skipping classes either. There never seemed to be time to catch up on things missed. Indeed, there never seemed to be enough time for many things. Grade twelve was also the time when you discovered how ignorant you really were. "What's wrong with this essay?" "Grade ten math, I'm supposed to remember that?" These were the types of questions asked by many students over and over again. Criticism and truth were things that had to be accepted.

Decisions were made and courses were dropped. Some classrooms filled while others emptied. All of a sudden the mail coming to your home was not addressed to "occupant" but to "student". Everybody wanted you but what did you want? What did you really want? You found there was little time to discover the answer to that question. Forms had to be filled, applications had

to be mailed, and always at the back of your mind there stood a mass of questions and decisions which awaited sorting.

It was not, however, an awful year. Many times laughter echoed from grade twelve rooms and sometimes you really enjoyed a class. The important thing was that you were learning. If you did not learn anything academic you learned about people, all sorts of people. You suddenly discovered that you knew half the people in the school. Furthermore, you were talking; in classrooms, corridors, the library, the study hall, and even in the park. It did not matter how you talked, about what, with whom, or where, for you were always learning, discovering new friends and rediscovering old ones. Even teachers appeared in a different light. They became old friends rather than merely part of the school architecture. When you needed help they were always there. Sometimes you just felt like saying, "Gee, you're great."

Yes, grade twelve did involve a great deal of work, but grade twelve students still managed to participate in many of the school's activities.

Those who had no time, found time. Indeed things like council, glee club, sports events, choir, and Unity '71 often ran on the energy and enthusiasm of grade twelve students. Now this may appear an egotistical point of view to some who feel that grade twelves tend to monopolize things in school, but something should be taken into consideration. This is the fact that perhaps grade twelve is the last time a student can be assured of a place at the top of a structure. We just wanted one last fling at being at the top and we happened to have some experience to back us. We were just summoning together our forces, assimilating what we had learned through the years, in and out of school. Then we expended some of that potential in school activities and now we will require the rest of it to step through the open door that stands before us, the door to the outside world.

At the end of grade twelve you suddenly feel yourself thrust from the warm security of the school that has sheltered you for the last six years. During that time you have been guided by many willing hands. But what awaits you now? Who waits for you? You do not really know so you make a decision and you take a risk. If you fail you try again. You are basically on your own and you must now struggle to be an

individual in that pool of people labelled "youth".

What about the youth of today? Much has been said. We are supposed to be rowdy, noisy, and terrible confused. Well, perhaps we are, but we are something more. There is something in us which could work for or against us. For a long time I myself did not really know what that something was. I saw struggling and rioting but I did not really understand. I was a member of the younger generation but I could not fully comprehend why we behave as we did. Then the answer accidentally appeared with a teacher of mine. At the time he was lecturing the class on their failure to complete some homework. In the course of his lecture he said, "you know, people, you know what's wrong with you? You want all the benefits but you don't want to go through all the hours of drill!" I heard no more after that because suddenly there lay the

Impatience is the major fault and virtue of today's young person. He had ideas and vitality but he fails to note the work that may need to be done or the tune it may take. Things are moving too quickly for him. The world is thrown at him and he must make an effort to catch it. Of course he worries about war, malnutrition, pollution, and over population. He aches to do something but he does not know exactly what. He only wants to get involved now. Unfortunately many in their haste take the wrong road. Others, frustrated and disgusted, drop out altogether. We have the energy but we lack the experience. We struggle not to be assimilated into a group, the victim of propaganda. Unfortunately we often trample over those who could help us, those with experience, the so-called older generation. If youth and the older generation could get together an invincible team might arise; progress might be made. There are many things which enrage young people but it takes more than rage and numbers to constitute progress. We, the youth of the twentieth century need the advice of the older generation even though we are slow to admit it.

In our own school this year, I was pleased at the success of Unity '71. Here was a project which required co-operation and a great deal of work. People were willing to listen, to work, and to understand. An effort at communication was made and it proved successful. I only wish

that the grade twelve graduates of this year take the same spirit of co-operation with them into the working world.

I also wish that the older generation would not anticipate us like a bomb looking for a place to explode. To many we seem like this but take the time to talk with us. Talk is the greatest safety valve there is. Education does not stop at the steps of an institution. One can always learn from many situations and many people. One just must stop condemning and start talking. Therefore, I address the youth of the world asking them not to condemn their elders merely on the basis of static, traditional views. Instead, find those with progressive views who are willing to give advice.

I also address the older generation asking that they do not condemn us on the basis of distant events. One should never condemn those that one cannot understand. Rather, remember the young people around you. The most heartening thing I ever saw was a mother who stood up to defend her university-aged son and his friends. She had come to realize that appearances meant nothing. She had taken the time to talk to her son and his friends and I could tell that she loved them all. She had made an effort at communication and she was surprised at


In closing then, I can only say that there is a wind of change in the air. I do not know how long it has been blowing or if it comes and goes with the times. I only know that it is blowing now and that we, the graduating grade twelves of 1970-'71, are walking into the midst of that wind. We take with us all we have learned in the past seventeen, eighteen, or nineteen years of our lives and I can only hope that we make good use of what we have learned, that we bring communication, and that there is a guiding hand somewhere before us.
