St. John's - a name that means a great deal to us and a name we will never forget. We were taught to learn and live here and we will never truly say good bye to this school.



United Kingdom Rugby Tour

\$T. JOHN'S HIGH SCHOOL RUGBY TEAM EXHIBITION GAMES - ENGLAND, 1977.

Stuffing envelopes and packaging flyers may not appeal to the average students as a leisure-time activity but this year's rugby players are a different story. If it served their goal of a trip to England, they would do it - appealing or not.

Under the leadership and guidance of Mr. Skett, Mr. Press and Mr. Mutchmor, 25 St. John's rugby players spent long hours discussing, organizing and raising money to do what has never been done by a St. John's team before – play in an exhibition series of games in an overseas country.

The idea surfaced last summer with Mr. Skett's wish to give what he thought of as an "exceptional team" an opportunity to compete against above standard teams. Through Mr. Press, arrangements were made to play five matches in the south of England using his old hometown of Gosport as home base.

By the time the departure date of March 16 arrived, sufficient funds had been raised with the help of the boys' parents who had come up with multifarious money-making ideas. "In a real sense," said Mr. Skett, "it was the parents who sent the kids to England."

Their first game against Churcher's College was closer than the 18-7 score indicates. Although St. John's lost, the coach felt they had learned more from this school concerning rugby playing technique than all the other schools together and he was proud they picked up new ideas so quickly. The second game was a comeback for the Tigers with a victory over Bay House School 34-0. Even the pouring rain and a semi-lake for a field could not stop the onslaught.

Playing their hosts, Brune Park School, proved to be a little tougher. In spite of the same high standard of play as in the previous two games, the score ended up 14-10 in favour of Brune Park. It was in fact an extremely close game that most spectators thought St. John's were unlucky not to win.


Defeat was revenged, however, when St. John's faced a Brune Park alumni team comprised of last year's players and emerged victorious 15-13. The last game was also one the Tigers could be proud of, with the defeat of the Gosport-Fareham Colts 7-3.

It is important to note that rugby fields and goal posts were not all the Tigers saw of England. During their stay as billots in Gosport, they managed to visit Stonehenge, Salisbury and Winchester Cathedrals, Nelson's flagship: H.M.S. Victory and the Tower of London. All of this was followed on the last day with a social in honour of the visitors, given by the parents of the Brune Park team. The atmosphere was electric, the coach said.

A three-day stay in London concluded their visit. Once memories of Buckingham Palace, Picadilly Circus and Windsor Castle (to name a few) were firmly implanted in their minds, the players were glad to turn to thoughts of home. Loaded down with souvenirs, new experiences and tired limbs, the Tigers returned to Winnipeg on the 31st of March.











Both coach and team should be congratulated on their efforts throughout the season.


















